



Season 2024 has been an incredibly successful one for the Under 9 boys at the Waverley Park Hawks. 












WRAY BRICK CO. **UNDER 13 GIRLS WRAY COACH'S REPORT**

ID SIGNS UNDER 14 COCHRANE COACH'S REPORT

On 29 January, 29 U14 Boys arrived for Day 1. 223 days later, two elite and resilient teams would play in two Grand Finals, 1W 1L, but all 44 U14 Boys are winners to us. We faced grading for the first time and, after 3 months of training and practice games, a top 18 took shape to form upper and lower division teams. Thirty-five players would go on to represent Team Cochrane (TC) which highlights the depth and development in our Village. Attitude, effort and respect became our mantra as leaders Angus Lord (C), Will Dresser (VC) and Lachie Cotter (VC) set standards, and Riley Cochrane planned drills and led by example to create an elite environment of nonnegotiables: voice, effort, intensity - this core enabled coaches to focus on craft and game-sense drills.

TC started the season against Murrumbeena and a fierce rivalry was born. We would play the Lions five times – LDLWL – each time building layers to our game and forming a plan: run and carry game to break the lines and make them accountable to stop us. Early rounds, we shuffled magnets to learn more about ourselves and test individuals. Three close losses sent us to Div 3, but the big loss was star utility Emre Soydan to injury. We had some tough internal conversations, but strong bonds were forming in the group.

R5 W over Ormond – we started to play as a team, and we started to believe. Capo led the way sacrificing his wing to setup our 4-3-2 zone. It started a trend.

R6 W over St Paul's Doggies as the General elevated his game as BOG and the Lieutenant kicked six in a masterclass of tick leads.

R7 East Brighton tested us, but Nathan Hayes went 'Beast mode', near matched by Tyler Battaglia and Tyce Corcoran who refused to give up a disposal. Our training – a fitness regime (shuttles, yo-yos, time trials), line concepts (J-defence, D50 exit), short 45s, overhead marking, layers, and testing the tackler - was starting to pay off.

R8 Murrumbeena again (D) and the back six was building – Caleb Sims and Mitch Adams started to shrink the ground and intercept the air, while Brodie Sutton, Marcus Pirotta and Marco Colalillo used leg-rope mentality to create F50 entries.

R9 Owen Tango-Shackson returned with raw power teaming up with Ryan White in attack and our wing rotations - Cameron De Couto, Christian Di Somma, Owen Pereira and Bentley Rohan - out-ran Beaumaris, while Aidan Liew could lock the back six.

R10, a Mordi-Brae grudge match – Will Dresser was on fire as Riley Mastromanno proved to be the Div 3 tap ruck working with Xavier Kelly, an inside-mid who led our goal kicking!

Injuries mounted. TC fielded 17 in later rounds (some on limited mins), desperate to avoid making players ineligible for Team Bloomfield ahead of their finals campaign - we trained 'icing games' and 'lock down' strategies. Then the speedy Zak Turner returned in a new back role, and finally Logan Irvine was elevated as the swingman for finals.

Qualifying Final – Beena. Everyone was nervous but we had a plan, and it worked! We tested the tackler, broke lines, owned 'their' corridor, and shutdown no.9 in the best performance of the year. 7.5.47 v 2.2.14.

One more step, the Grand Final – Beena again. Sadly, it was not our day, and we fell short. 2.1.13 v 5.4.34. We could not be prouder of the U14 Boys, all 44 of them – now we rest, reset, and go again to take **one more step...**
